Celebrity Dumb Charades

This is a twist on the classic game of Charades. You divide yourselves into teams or couples. Then you all write down names of famous couples, dead or alive, together or divorced and put them in a bowl. You act out the couple you end up choosing. The team that gets the most right wins.

Wedding Ring Mix Up

Everyone takes off their wedding rings and adds them to a bowl. Blindfolded partners try to find their or their partners wedding ring. The person who finds both rings wins.

Laugh Out Loud Honey

This would be a great game to add hilarity. Each partner tries to keep a straight face as their other half tries to make them laugh. No tickling allowed, mind you !

Cupid Says

Each person gets a turn playing leader. Play "Cupid Says" instead of "Simon Says" with each other. This game is great for children as well. Include some Valentine's Day ideas such as "Give me a kiss" or "Give someone a hug".

Hearts Everywhere

Give your friends and loved ones sweet notes! Have everyone write down what they love about each other on pieces of heart or paper. Then take each note and stick it on a giant heart and tape them up on a wall or door. A great photo opportunity. And memoir to boot !!

Made for Each Other

Cut out heart shapes from construction paper and write a famous word pair on each heart (such as “peanut butter / jelly” or “salt / pepper”), then cut apart the hearts into two pieces with one word on each piece. Mix up all the pieces, and then hand everyone a piece or have them pick up from a bowl. Then in a minute let everyone should find their partners. Enjoy the chaos !!

WHO is WHO?

You will need sticker paper and a marker for this game. Write down the name of at least twenty romance films, Titanic, Love Actually, Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind, The Notebook, etc., on the stickers. As your guests arrive put one on their back. Throughout the party they can ask questions about their movie but no one can reveal the answer. It is similar to 20 questions. When they think they have guessed it, go to the host and announce it!

Meet Again

As your guests arrive, have pens and paper set out. Have each couple write down some funny or interesting facts about their relationship. For example, we met at the grocery store or we only dated for a month before we were married, any little facts will work. Have them fold them up and put them in a bowl. Once everyone has arrived, hand each couple a paper and pen and read off the facts on the papers, one by one. The guests are to then write down which couple they believe it pertains to. It makes for great conversation pieces throughout the party.

Even the children who can enjoy by writing down something fun about themselves. Their friends can take turns guessing which is for whom.

Broken hearts

Make copies of our broken heart printables onto several sheets of card stock and cut out the designs. Then cut designs apart along the lines indicated. Break kids/adults into teams of three or four and have them piece together the puzzle hearts. Whichever team puts their broken heart together fastest wins.

You can also do this with at home with just heart shaped card stock papers. Just make sure each heart is uniquely cut.

Know Me Well

A classic couples party game. This game is fun, simple, and entertaining. Hand out two sheets of paper to each of your guests. Then ask them to write 5 things they like on one sheet of paper, and 5 things their partner likes on the other sheet of paper. The list could include anything from food and travel to books and movies. The couple who gets the highest number of matches wins the game. Your guests will love this couples party game. This game is also nice, because everyone will get to know each other better.

Sing For Me

Ask your guests to sing a romantic song for their sweetheart. This will make your guests feel involved and it will keep everyone entertained. You can pick someone as judge and ask them to rate the participants. The song that they choose, and how well it is presented. The couple who gets the highest rating wins the competition.

You can even make this a team game by having one partner dedicate a song and the other act it out.

Roses are red, Poems are Sweet

Take a white board or paper and set out romantic words like hearts, lips, candlelight etc. On the other set of cards write some non romantic words like ironing board, wallpaper paste, nose hair, motor oil etc. Then ask the couple to draw one card each from the set of romantic index card and non romantic index card. Then ask the couples to come up with an interesting love poem.

Guess Them Out

One person is “it” and will say a statement such as “Things you shouldn’t do on your anniversary.” Everyone then writes on a piece of paper something that shouldn’t be done on your anniversary like forgetting it. The person who is “it” then collects all the answers and reads them out loud. Then, go around the room letting people guess who guessed what. The people whose answer are most common are out of the game. Keep going till one person is left. That person has the most out of box answers will win.

Love is Blind

Have two or four people go up to the chalkboard at once blindfolded. Hand each a piece of chalk. Ask each person to draw a heart on the chalkboard. It will be fun laughing with each other when they see the silly shapes they’ve actually drawn. Take more turns trying to draw other Valentine theme objects like a flower, a puppy, candy etc.

Relay Fun

Write instructions on many hearts/notes like Hop like a Bunny, Walk like a Zombie, Run funny, Walk like a Crab, Skip in Love, Twirl Around, Laugh out Loud, Pretend to play a Violin, Play an Air Guitar, Do Square Dancing, Do the Twist, Pretend to make Toast, Hug Yourself, Drink Coffee, Run in a circle, Jumping Jacks, Hoppity Hop, Play Drums, Sing a Song, Eat a Pizza, Jump up High, Go gymming, Do a push up, Wave your hands in the air, Sleep and snore, Power walk, Go Swim, Do a water sport, Hug a friend, Kiss a hand.

Divide into two teams. Put the hearts at the end of the room in two piles. Set the timer to a one minute. On your mark the first person on each team runs to the pile, takes a heart and does what the heart says, while returning to their team, then sits down. The team to do the most actions in a minute wins.

Musical Valentines

One person is selected as the leader (who remains out of the game) all players then get into a circle and each is given a piece of paper to write a silly thing to do without letting others see what they have written. On the leaders command players then start to pass the pieces of paper around the circle waiting for the command to stop. When this happens two people are chosen to carry out the instructions on the pieces of paper they have, without laughing. Those who laugh are out. Repeat until only two people left.

Telegrams

This is a hilarious party game that requires some quick thinking. Issue each person with a pencil and paper. Players then call out letters in turn (up to about fifteen) which everyone writes down. The aim of the game is to use those letters in the order written down to make a sentence with each letter being the start of a word. After one minute each player reads out his sentence and the one judged to be the funniest is the winner. It's much more fun if players can include the names of the guests.

Be a Prince

One minute couple party game in which male partner has to find female partner's shoe pair and bring it back to her and put it on her foot without any assistance from the princess herself.

Tie a Knot

This is a great game in the winters. Put everyone's scarves or if the host has enough in a pile. Each couple has to stand back to back and one of the partner has to tie maximum scarfs around them in under a minute. The couple with the most scarves tied wins.

Talk Fast or Lose

This is a great timer game that's a take on the Ellen Degeneres game 5 Second Rule. This also could be played with teams or partners against each other. A strict time keeper is necessary for this one. You ask the participant 3 things to name in 5 seconds. You can increase the time depending on the participants. Below is a list of questions you can use.

- Name three things your kids play with.
- Name three things you wake up to do.
- Name three things your kids love doing.
- Name three things your spouse loves to eat.
- Name three places you have visited together.
- Name three places you visited together before getting married.
- Name three habits that your partner hates.
- Name three foods that your kids eat.
- Name three things couples do.
- Name three things in this room.
- Name three people you admire.
- Name three places you want to visit.
- Name three things your partner hates.
- Name three foods you hate.
- Name three things you do before sleeping.
- Name three sweet treats.
- Name three places you have dated.
- Name three of your partner's relatives.
- Name three of your partner's friends.
- Name three things you write with.
- Name three phases of a relationship.
